18. SUPERINTENDENT'S CLOSING REMARKS

Dr. Moyer stated at the last meeting that an 8th grade Northport Middle School cross country runner set the school record at the county meet and he wanted to mention the name of the student who is Fiona King. Dr. Moyer congratulated Angelo Cocchiola for being appointed as the new Northport Middle School principal. On November 8th the Unified Athletics students and Best Buddies club participated in the Suffolk County Special Olympics team building activities. Pulaski Road Elementary School hosted a production of Willy Wonka. On November 19th, the ELL luncheon was held at the William J. Brosnan School. Northport High School Seniors participated in the annual day of service yesterday.

Dr. Moyer provided a general overview of the current enrollment: K-4 has an average class size of 19.3. The high school has 67 classes with 15 or less students which include Project Lead the Way, Science Research and AP 2D/3D Art. These do not count any special education, ELL or Port Academy classes.

At the December 12th Board Meeting, Dr. Moyer will present a multi-year administrative reorganization plan for the District which will include some administrative reductions which will coincide with the budget management process and declining enrollment.

Dr. Moyer stated that information regarding regionalization has been posted to the website under announcements. There is a lot of frustration in communities across Long Island regarding this. The local superintendents have been discussing this and are being told that no schools are going to be forced to participate in any aspect of the regionalization plan if it is not beneficial to the school district. What the professional associations in the area are trying to do is to get the State to change the language to be consistent with what the intent is. Dr. Moyer believes the regionalization plan is tied to the Rockefeller Study and the budget that Governor Hochul will present in January. The local superintendents have met several times with this dominating the conversation and there is unanimous agreement that they are going to collectively, as a group, participate in the things that we think are mutually beneficial for our local districts. The BOCES superintendent is involved in these conversations and she is going to construct a plan that is beneficial for the region. Dr. Moyer stated that he recognizes that the emergency regulation is troubling and do think we need to be vigilant and monitor this and be on top of this.

There was a discussion among the Board regarding drafting a letter stating that the language in the regulation should align with what they are saying. There was a consensus of the Board that a letter should be sent and contact information for the public to voice their concerns be posted on the website.

Trustee McNaughton brought up the day of service the high school students participated in and in particular where kids raked leaves for members of the community. Ms. McNaughton stated she received a phone call from someone who recently fell on hard times and came home to a bunch of kids raking her leaves. She was completely overwhelmed and thankful. Ms. McNaughton thanked Northport High School Principal Rob Dennis for coming up with the great idea of a day of service and how wonderful it is to show the students in a different light.
